Payment of \$300 site fee AND payment for the estimated number of animals to be scored plus applicable taxes is due with the application.

These fees are non-refundable in the case of cancellation by the herd owner. In addition, herd owners will be invoiced for an additional \$100.00 cancellation fee if the herd owner cancels classification.

Members will be invoiced after classification if the number of animals actually classified exceeds the estimated number of animals for which initial payment was made.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Society adheres to a Non-Selective program which requires that **ALL FIRST FRESHENER** animals on the farm be presented for classification. At the option of the herd owner, any unclassified animals in 2nd or later lactation may be presented for classification and any previously classified animal may be presented for a possible raise in classification score.

When applying for classification, herd owners are subject to all existing rules and regulations of the Canadian Goat Society, which govern this program.
